1. Philadelphia St. John Neumann-St. Maria Goretti (9-0) (Philadelphia Catholic League)

A 72-66 win in the championship game at the **Bogangles Shootout**, over Durham Mount Zion propels the Saints to #1 in the state. In September of this year the former St. John Neumann (boys only) and St. Maria Goretti (girls only) combined and thus became know as Neumann-Goretti. It was the first time ever that boys and girls attended the same Catholic High School in South Philadelphia. They also have a new nickname, the Saints. The Saints won first six games before heading to Charlotte, North Carolina for the **BOJANGLES SHOOTOUT**. They defeated Harriton 67-43 and American Christian 82-68 to win the **MALVERN PREP TIP-OFF**, then defeated Penn Charter 74-45, Abington Friends 51-47, Philadelphia Archbishop Wood, 64-56 and Philadelphia Southern 76-50. In the first round in Charlotte they defeated Charlotte Latin 94-66. Then they defeated Portsmouth I.C. Norcom, Va 64-48 to reach the championship game. 6-5 Sr **David Burton** is surrounded by four top notch underclassmen in junior guards **Earl Pettis** 6-5 and **Derrick "D. J." Rivera** 6-2, 6-2 soph **Antonio "Scoop" Jardine** and 6-7 So **Richard Jackson**. Other key players are 6-6 sr center **Phil Love** and 5-7 sr guard **Conor Kennedy**.

2. Episcopal Academy (9-1) (Philadelphia Inter-Academic League)

The Churchmen opened the season with wins over Abington Friends 65-61, Philadelphia LaSalle 54-34, The Hill School 61-47 and Philadelphia West Catholic 59-45. They then traveled to Fort Myers, Florida for the **CITY OF PALMS CLASSIC**. They started with a 76-62 win over Laplace Reserve Christian, LA. Suffered only loss so far when they were edged by Florida's #1 team, Arlington Country Day, 56-55. Finished off tourney with victories over Fort Myers 77-53 and Wisconsin's #1 team, Milwaukee Vincent 58-53. Then at the **WIDENER SHOWCASE** they rattled the PIAA's top team, Chester 83-68. Finished off 2004 with a 60-46 win over Philadelphia North Catholic. They are led by their junior All-American guard combo of **Wayne Ellington** 6-4 and **Gerald Henderson** 6-5. The two are generally recognized as the best guard combo in the country. Others are 5-8 sr **Dylan Brown**, 6-1 sr **Joe Rosati**, 6-7 jr **Mike Yocum**, 6-0 sr **Brian FitzPatrick**, 6-7 soph **Mike Nealis**.

3. Philadelphia Germantown Academy (12-2) (Philadelphia Inter-Academic League)

Opened season with an 80-53 victory over Academy Of the New Church. Then won the **PHILLY HOOPS INVITATIONAL** with victories over Wissahickon 71-62 and Roman Catholic 61-55. Then in the **GONZAGA DC CLASSIC**, they lost in the first round to Baltimore Mount St. Joseph's 59-56 but

took 5th place with wins over Westbury Christian, TX 71-61 and Washington St. Albans 66-48. Then they defeated Friends Central 55-46 before playing in the **MAKE A WISH TOURNAMENT @ GA**. Playing without pg **Kyle Griffin** and **Joe Traynor** and with injuries to both **Ryan Ayers** and **Brian Grimes** the Patriots first defeated Peddie School 61-49 but then lost to Public League power, Central 47-46. Bounced back to defeat a strong Philadelphia St. Joe Prep 45-31 and Philadelphia LaSalle 65-40. Then in the **WIDENER SHOWCASE**, they defeated Chester 59-56 and Haddonfield, NJ 68-57. Patriots returned seniors **Ryan Ayers** 6-7 (Notre Dame bound), **Brian Grimes** 6-7, **Kirk Jones** 6-2 and 6-9 junior **Andrew Ott**. 6-1 soph **Kyle Griffin** is running the point and 6-4 junior **Joe Traynor** and 6-2 junior **Shane Simon** all are getting playing time.

4. Chester (4-5) (District 1 AAAA)

How can you be rated this high when you lose five games in a row in December. Well when you play this kind of schedule that's how. Check it out. Don't agree? Well when you beat a team like Lancaster by 30pts, when Steelton-Highspire beat them by 8 then that's why. Until they lose to a PIAA school this is where they stay. The Clippers opened the season by smashing Lancaster 82-52 then hit the road for the rest of December. They started at St. Dominic's High on Long Island with an 80-63 win over All Hallows. Then it was off to California for the **LOS ANGELES CITY CLASSIC**. They won their first two games beating Pasadena Blair, CA 82-49 and Norfolk Granby, VA 58-57. They were then beaten 58-56 by Etiwanda, CA in the semifinals. Also lost in the 3rd place game, 68-48 to Clovis West, Back home the Clippers played in the **WIDENER SHOWCASE**. where they lost three more games, but again to highly regarded teams. First came a loss to our #3 team, Germantown Academy 69-56, then was a loss to #2 Episcopal Academy 83-68, then they took Haddonfield, NJ into overtime before losing 64-62. 6-9 sr **Kenny Tribbett**, 6-5 sr **Noel Wilmore**, 6-4 sr **Devon McClendon** and 6-1 jr **Darrin Govens** start most games for Fred Pickett, but any of the these other players could be found starting at any time. And they are 6-4 sr **Tyrone Bradley**, 6-1 sr **Terron Covington**, 6-4 jr **Shakiyl Reid**, 6-2 sr **Charles Swiggett**, 6-0 sr **Darrell Mosley**, 6-4 jr **Derrick Nichols**. Rounding out the roster are 6-3 sr **Brian Chambers**, 5-9 sr **Quron Cooper**, 6-2 jr **Lamene Church** and 6-3 sr **Karington Corbin**.

5. Steelton-Highspire (12-0) (AAA)

Rollers led by **TnT** otherwise know as **Tramayne Hawthorne** a 6-1 sr and **Tristan Crawford** a 6-4 sr headed to Drexel roared to a perfect December. They opened the season by winning the **STEELTON-HIGHSPIRE TIP-OFF** defeating Middletown 90-41 and Oxford 65-50. Then defeated strong Central Dauphin 87-78 and bitter rival Trinity 70-66. Then came victories over Central Dauphin East 77-53, Harrisburg Bishop McDevitt 77-40, York Northeastern 97-37, Carlisle 75-57 and Cumberland Valley 77-55. Took the championship at the **TORNADO HOLIDAY CLASSIC** in Lancaster by crushing York 87-57 and stopping Lancaster 72-64. Other starters are **Jerel Layman** a 6-3 jr, **Tyrell Bookhart** a 6-4 sr and **Sean Alexander** a 5-11 sr. Others that see action are, **Lance Chisholm** 5-11 Fr, **Jerel Lewis** 6-0 Jr, **Chris Haigh** 5-11 jr, **Stewart Young** 5-11 jr, **Jason Zimmerman** 6-0 soph, **Skyler Kemp** 6-2 jr, **Nick Pogasic** 5-11 jr and **Jordan Krovic** 6-5 jr.

6. Harrisburg (10-0) (District 3 AAAA)

Started the season with a hard-fought 71-68 win at Reading. Then won Mid-:Penn League games

over Central Dauphin East 70-45, Harrisburg Bishop McDevitt 74-37, Chambersburg 57-44, Carlisle 55-49 in overtime, Cumberland Valley 69-58 and Cedar Cliff 64-55. Clubbed Williamsport 73-40. Then won the championship at their own **SLAM FEST HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT** with hard fought victories over powerhouses, Pittsburgh Schenley 61-59 and Cheltenham 55-52 in the title game. Smallwood has a very deep and talented team, although it is still a young team and he uses everyone of the players. Starters are, **Jamal Jackson** 6-2 sr, **Bryan Majors** 5-10 jr, **William Royal** 6-6 sr, **Alfonso Dawson** 6-3 soph and **LaRon Williams** 6-3 soph. The others are, **Brian Peterson** 6-0 sr, **Quincy Roberts**, **Cordell Burnette**, **Brian Smoot** 5-10 sr, **Justin Taylor**, **Erich Majors** 5-10 jr, **Lamar Drayton** 6-0 soph, **Maurice Baskins**, **Ricardo Brown** 6-4 soph and **Nate Brown**.

7. Cheltenham (9-2) (District 1 AAAA)

The Panthers opened the season with victories over Neshaminy 58-34 and Wissahickon 62-47. They then lost to Brooklyn Lincoln 69-66. Came back and crushed Upper Moreland 83-39, Upper Merion 72-32 and then in the **READING SNEAKER VILLA SHOOTOUT**, Parkland fell 75-46. They then edged the Philadelphia Pub League's top team Simon Gratz 55-51. Then blasted Upper Dublin 74-26 and Coatesville 80-54. In Harrisburg's **SLAM FEST HOLIDAY CLASSIC**, the Panther's defeated Lebanon 68-41 before losing to the host Cougars 55-52 in a great battle. Cheltenham lost little from last year's squad and are again led by the **Mansell** brothers, **Harris Mansell** a 6-3 sr headed to Rider and **Patrick Mansell** a 6-1 jr. 5-11 sr pg **Patrick Fleury** runs the show and the other two starters are usually 6-3 jr **Christian Christopher** and 6-3 sr **Chris Pender**. 8. Philadelphia St. Joseph's Prep (10-1) (Philadelphia Catholic League)

The Hawks had only one main player back from last year, 6-4 jr **Reggie Redding**, but coach Speedy Morris has them ready to fight for another Catholic League title. Others that back up **Redding** are 5-11 sr **Joe Fox**, 6-1 sr **Corey O'Rourke**, 6-1 jr **Dave Stefanski**, 6-5 jr **Mike Lombardi**, 6-2 jr **Mike McCauley** and 6-3 jr **James Olberlies**. This is a young team with only two seniors among the top 7 and three of the top 16. They started the season with a 76-66 victory over Richmond Benedictine, VA. Then they won the **CHESTNUT HILL TIP-OFF** with wins over Chestnut Hill Academy 50-35 and Abinton Friends 62-42. Then defeated Pennsbury 62-38, Philadelphia Penn Charter 47-30, Pub power Simon Gratz 53-49 and Springfield Delco 77-42. Suffered only loss to Germantown Academy 45-31. Came back strong by winning the **SCHOLASTIC PLAY-BY-PLAY HOLIDAY CLASSIC** at Plymouth-Whitemarsh with wins over Plymouth-Whitemarsh 68-52 and Ridley 61-45. Finished 2004 with a 69-28 win over Philadelphia LaSalle.

9. Philadelphia Roman Catholic (8-2) (Philadelphia Catholic League)

Started season in the **PHILLY HOOPS INVITATIONAL** where they defeated Philadelphia North Catholic 73-57 before losing to Germantown Academy 61-55 in the final. Bounced back and defeated Philadelphia Father Judge 63-36 and Philadelphia Bishop McDevitt 89-69 before heading to Hawaii for the **IOLANI HOLIDAY CLASSIC**. They started off with a 66-44 win over Honolulu Kamehamehi before losing to highly regarded Los Angeles Fairfax 58-48. Then beat the host school, Honolulu Iolani 55-50 and Punahou 48-41 to finish 5th. Finished off 2004 in the **READING HOLIDAY**

TOURNAMENT. And won that championship by defeating Upper Darby 72-45 and Reading 62-45. 6-5 sr **Malik Perry**, 6-0 sr **Bobby Jordan** and 5-8 jr **Raymond "Doodles" Sims** are the left over breadwinners for Speedy Morris' Cahillites. Others are 6-6 soph transfer **Mike Ringgold**, 5-11 sr **Bill Lally** and soph twins 6-3 **Bradley Wanamaker** and 6-2 **Brian Wanamaker**.

10. Philadelphia Simon Gratz (8-5) (Philadelphia Public League-District 12 AAAA)

The Bulldogs are once again the class of the Pub League but have not fared that well outside the league. They opened the season at the **PITTSBURGH SCHENLEY TIP-OFF** where they won the championship with victories over Pittsburgh Central Catholic 63-45 and Pittsburgh Schenley 54-53. Then they were mauled by Manhasset St. Mary's, Long Island, NY, 74-44. They came right back and defeated Philadelphia Parkway 76-47, but then lost to St. Joseph's Prep 53-49. Back in the Pub they destroyed Roxborough 77-33 and Furness 65-34. They stepped out again and were beaten by Cheltenham 55-51. Back to the Pub again saw two more big wins, 55-34 over Southern and 60-17 over Franklin Towne Charter. They spent the Holiday in Bristol, TN at the **ARBY'S CLASSIC**. Started with a 42-40 win over tiny Twin Springs, VA, but lost to Provo Timpview, Utah 62-49 and Urspring, Germany 48-38. They are led by a pair of transfers in 6-5 sr **Ameer Ali** (Roxborough) and 6-0 jr **Malik Alvin** (Abraham Lincoln). Others among the top seven are 5-11 **Jamar Bruce**, 6-8 sr **Abdullah Moon**, 6-3 sr **Syheem Perkins**, 6-4 jr **Sean Gilbert** and 6-3 sr **Raheem Miller**.

11. Erie Cathedral Prep (9-2) (District 10 AAAA)

The Ramblers started their season with a 73-66 loss to Cleveland St. Ignatius. They then defeated Erie Mercyhurst Prep 54-36, Erie Strong Vincent 64-51, Erie East 55-46, Fort LeBoeuf 61-45 and Franklin 52-48. Then at the **KRUEL CLASSIC** in Coral Springs, FL they lost to eventual champion, Queens Holy Cross 62-58 in the first round. Came back to take Silver Medal with wins over St. Petersburg, FL 53-48, Tabor Academy, MA 49-42 and South Broward, FL 71-33. Back home they stopped Warren 71-53 to end 2004. The starters for this deep Prep team are usually 5-10 sr guard **Cory Knight**, **Nick Haller** a 5-10 sr guard, **Adam Kaiser** a 5-10 jr guard, **Earl Matson** a 6-3 jr forward and 6-5 jr forward **Mark Demski**. Others who see time are **Brian Mahoney** 5-11 sr, **Derek Brower** 6-5 jr, **Matt Pluta** 6-3 jr, **Eric Schumaker** and 6-5 jr **Marty Lindenberger**.

12. McKeesport (11-1) (District 7 AAAA)

The Tigers get the early nod here as the top team from the WPIAL. There is controversy over who the top team out there is, but the Tigers have a 67-46 win over Jeannette (who's only other loss is to Potomac, VA) and 54-52 over strong Pittsburgh Schenley. The loss is not a good one, 67-52 to defending AAAA state champ, Penn Hills, but is only one loss. Opened the season winning the **NORWIN TIP-OFF** with victories over Jeannette and Duquesne 74-36. Then came a 55-45 win over Blackhawk, 64-45 over West Mifflin, 63-33 over Duquesne, 59-37 over Gateway, 57-43 over Franklin Regional and 55-47 over Pittsburgh Central Catholic. They won the **McKEESPORT HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT** by defeating West Mifflin 69-48 and Duquesne 49-46. Usual starters are, 5-8 jr **Robert Doily**, 6-0 sr **DeWill Commodore**, 6-2 jr **Anthony Leonard**, 6-5 sr **Asown Sayles** and 6-4 sr **Lawrence Green**. Others who get plenty of PT are, 5-11 jr **Tyler Blackburn**, 6-1 jr **Dan Kopolovich**, 6-4 fr **Devon Alexander**, 6-1 jr **Travis McBride**, and 6-2 jr **Dana McBride**.

13. Whitehall (11-1) (District 11 AAAA)

The Zephyrs reeled off six consecutive wins to start the season, then after a 57-52 loss to Emmaus they have won five more in a row. Started with victories over Williamsport 52-34 and York 43-34 in the **WHITEHALL TIP-OFF**. Added to that with wins over Nazareth 63-48, Bethlehem Freedom 56-40, Allentown Dieruff 48-23 and Allentown Allen 63-58 in overtime. After the loss to Emmaus they gave Allentown Central Catholic their only loss with a 45-32 win and dumped Parkland 43-28. Won the **ZEPHYR HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT** with wins over Southern Lehigh 51-32 and Bethlehem Liberty 53-42. Ended 2004 by defeating Pottsville 61-45. Four starters returned from last year, led by all-state candidate 5-8 sr **Jason Greene**, 6-1 sr **Kyle Conrad**, 6-1 sr **Will Lanier** and 6-4 sr **Aaron Scholl**. Others that play are 6-4 sr **Matt Zwetolitz**, 6-2 sr **John Bowen**, 5-9 sr **Jimmy Felix**, 5-9 sr **Nate Gillespie**, 5-9 sr **Tommy Gross** and 6-4 sr **Jim Luchansky**.

14. Pittsburgh Schenley (9-3) (Pittsburgh City-District 8 AAAA)

All three losses have come to teams rated above them in PA. Started season playing in the **SCHENLEY TIP-OFF** where they smashed Philadelphia Girard College 60-35 and then were edged by Philadelphia Simon Gratz 54-53 in the final. Came back and defeated Pittsburgh Central Catholic 85-70, Pittsburgh Brashear 64-57, Brentwood 72-52, Pittsburgh Oliver 62-58. Then was beaten by McKeesport 54-52. Came back with wins over city foes, Langley 57-22, Peabody 72-53 and Carrick 79-62. Then traveled east to Harrisburg for the **SLAM FEST HOLIDAY CLASSIC**. They pushed Harrisburg to the limit before losing 61-59. Took the consolation game with a 53-44 win over Lebanon. The Spartans often start three sophomores in 6-7 **DeJuan Blair**, 6-4 **D.J. Kennedy** and 5-10 **Jamaal Bryant**. Others who also start are 5-8 jr **Derrick Clancy**, 6-2 jr **Kenny Johnson** and 6-0 sr **Fred Wilburn**. Others that see action are 6-5 jr **Leonard Green**, 6-4 sr **Gospel Jackson**, 6-2 jr **Gerald Brooks**, 6-0 fr **Greg Blair** and 6-3 jr **David Hall**.

15. Ridley (9-2) (District 1 AAAA)

The Green Raiders run the Princeton offense and are the kind of team that could give Chester and Cheltenham trouble come District tourney time. They raced to 9 wins to start the season but lost their last two of the month. They started off winning the **RIDLEY TIP-OFF** with wins over West Chester Henderson 60-46 and Springfield Cardinal O'Hara 56-39. They added to that with a 73-46 win over Haverford, 59-41 over Lower Merion, 66-35 over Marple Newtown, 64-34 over Penncrest, 68-29 over Radnor and 70-60 over Conestoga. In the **SCHOLASTIC PLAY-BY-PLAY HOLIDAY CLASSIC**, they gave Philadelphia Central their only loss with a 60-56 victory, but were beaten in the championship game by Philadelphia St. Joseph's Prep 61-45. Ridley did not pick themselves back up and lost at Glen Mills 64-40 to end 2004. Their top players are 6-2 sr, Pennsylvania U. bound **Kevin Egee**, 6-4 sr **Matt McDevitt** and 5-11 jr pg **Dino Vasso**. The other starters are usually a pair of 6-3 seniors, **Kenny Elkind** and **Kirk Waldig**. Others that play are **Robby Litwa**, **Marcus Payton**, **Matt Hummel**, **Adam McKinley**, **Kyle Carney** and freshman **Steve Eggy**.

16. Philadelphia Central (11-1) Philadelphia Public League-District 12 AAAA)

Won the **GLEN MILLS TIP-OFF** with wins over Philadelphia Lambertton 79-49 and Glen Mills 82-72. Then ripped off wins against Philadelphia foes, Furness 80-51, Engineering & Science 53-33, Southern 77-61, Franklin Towne Charter 78-25, Archbishop Ryan 42-40, Swenson 89-42, Bok Tech 92-73 and the shocker, a 47-46 win over Germantown Academy. Then in the **SCHOLASTIC PLAY-BY-PLAY HOLIDAY CLASSIC**, the Lancers were upset in the opener by Ridley 60-56 but came back to defeat Plymouth-Whitemarsh 68-63 in the consolation game. Lancers are led by 6-3 Drexel signee **Scott Rodgers** and 6-3 sr swingman **Andre Woodlin**. Two other key Lancers are **Rashiid Coleman** a 5-9 jr and **Kenny St. George** a 6-4 jr. Others are 5-10 sr **Lamar Williams**, 6-4 jr **Joseph Graves** and 6-1 sr **Marcellus Garrett**.

17. State College (8-1) (District 6 AAAA)

The Little Lions opened the season with a 67-30 win over Pittsburgh Shady Side Academy. Then defeated DuBois 66-22 and Shamokin 58-37 before losing to Shaler 58-51. They bounced back from the loss with a 70-60 road win over West York and clubbed Williamsport 73-40 and Cumberland Valley 65-51. They won the **STATE COLLEGE KIWANIS HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT** defeating Mastic Beach William Floyd, NY 69-47 and Levittown Harry Truman 70-69. The veteran guns for the Little Lions are 6-8 jr **Eric Meister**, 6-1 sr **Kevin Kanaskie**, 6-5 sr **Keith Hardin**, 5-11 sr **Jason Miller** and 5-10 sr **Ian Stringer**. Others who see action are 6-3 sr **Joe Bevins** and 5-11 sr **Brady Hart**,

18. Plymouth-Whitemarsh (8-2) (District 1 AAAA)

Opened the season with 8 consecutive wins but then lost twice in the **SCHOLASTIC PLAY-BY-PLAY HOLIDAY CLASSIC**. The losses came to Philadelphia's St. Joseph's Prep 68-52 and Central 68-63. They began the season by winning the **ROCK THE RIM TIP-OFF TOURNAMENT** with wins over Central Bucks South 84-62 and Conestoga 73-58. Also defeated Abington 55-48, Upper Merion 85-57, Springfield Montco 93-41, Upper Moreland 85-46, Hatboro-Horsham 80-48 and Wissahickon 77-67. 6-4 sr **Thomas Young** has been lighting up the scoreboard at a 28.7ppg clip. Three other starters returned in 6-0 soph **Lance Wilson**, 6-0 jr **Ronald Moore** and 6-2 jr **Da'Rel Scott**. The other starter is 6-5 sr Chris Mayer. Others who play are 6-0 jr **Earl Crockett**, 5-9 sr **Travis Hobson**, 6-5 soph **Greg Maugle**, 5-10 sr **Mike Mullen**, 5-11 soph **Mike Acquaviva**, 6-4 jr **Zach Thomas** and 5-10 sr **Sean Gordon**.

19. Beaver Falls (10-2) (District 7 AA)

Began season winning the **HOPEWELL TIP-OFF** with victories over Riverview 90-44 and Center 62-55. Outscored Quaker Valley 98-80. In the **PENN HILLS TIP-OFF** the Tigers edged North Allegheny 57-54 but were then beaten by Mount Lebanon 67-59. Bounced back and defeated New Brighton 75-40, Center 61-42, Rochester 90-32 and South Side Beaver 91-34. In the **BLACKHAWK HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT**, they reached the final with a 61-47 win over Yough and a 61-52 win over Kennedy Catholic. They lost in the final to Virginia's #1 team Potomac 67-62 in a great game. Potomac coaches and players said that the Tigers played like an Eastern Region (Virginia) team and that is a high complement to the Tigers. That game helped push Beaver Falls into the top 20 and solidified their spot as the #1 AA team in the state. 20. Allentown Central Catholic (10-1) (District 11 AAA)

The Vikings lone loss of the season is to Whitehall 45-32. As for the moment, with all due respect to Oxford, they are ranked #2 in the state in AAA. They started the season with a 55-38 win over Green Pond Notre Dame. Then defeated Bethlehem Liberty 63-52, Northampton 73-54, Allentown Allen 63-55, Parkland 50-36, Allentown Dieruff 68-66 and Philadelphia Prep Charter 55-40 before the loss to Whitehall.
